ARP ESSER III Grant Program

Program Purpose

The intent and purpose of ARP of 2021, ESSER III funding is to help safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on students.

Grant Award: \$1,955,476, Required 20% Set Aside of \$391,095.20 to address Learning Loss

Grant Period: Pre-Award (3/13/2020) through Summer of 2024

What are the plans for spending the remaining funds for ESSER III?

Godley ISD will spend the remaining ESSER III funds in the following areas:

1. Tutoring - Godley ISD will spend approximately \$34,000 in tutoring costs. This will help address the required \$391,095.20 that we must spend for learning loss
2. Curriculum - Godley ISD will spend \$257,000 in various curricula to help address learning loss
3. Salaries - Godley ISD will continue with various salary costs for Character and Leadership Staff (\$100,000)

Godley ISD will be following COVID-19 protocols below for the remainder of the 2021-2022 school year:

Student Protocols:

- **IF Positive:**
 - 10-day quarantine from symptom onset
 - May return after 10 days if:
 - fever free for 24 hours -and-
 - other symptoms have improved
- **IF Symptomatic:**
 - 10-day quarantine -or-
 - Alternative diagnosis from a physician -or-
 - Negative COVID test from a physician or testing site
- **IF Close Contact:**
 - Parents of students who are determined to be close contacts of an individual with COVID-19 may opt to keep their students at home during the recommended stay-at-home period:
 - 10-day quarantine -or-
 - 7-day quarantine accompanied by a negative test on day 6 or 7 of quarantine
 - Monitor for symptoms

**Students or staff with a member(s) of your household that is COVID positive should quarantine for close contact unless vaccinated or diagnosed COVID positive within the last 90 days*

Staff Protocols:

Staff Who Have COVID-19 or Who are Close Contacts:

School systems must exclude staff from attending school in person who are actively sick with COVID-19, who are suspected of being actively sick with COVID-19, or who have received a positive test result for COVID-19.

Based on recent updates from the CDC, staff may return when:

If symptomatic, at least 5 days have passed since symptom onset, and fever free*, and other symptoms have improved.

For those with no symptoms, at least 5 days after the day they tested positive. *Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever suppressing medications. Fever is a temperature of 100° Fahrenheit (37.8° Celsius) or higher.

Godley ISD will continue to follow heightened health protocols that include, but are not limited to: the continued practice of thorough sanitization and hand-washing protocols, encouraging social distancing when possible, and making face coverings optional. We ask that staff and student(s) stay home if they are sick or showing symptoms. The District will also continue to monitor the number of COVID-19 cases in our area and make adjustments as needed according to guidance from the Texas Education Agency (TEA).

How the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff will be maintained:

Masking

- Face coverings are optional as ordered by Executive Order GA-38

Modifications for social/physical distancing

- Social distancing is encouraged when possible
- Incentives are given to find opportunities for outdoor learning, and to use spaces where distancing is more easily achievable

Handwashing and respiratory etiquette

- Handwashing etiquette posters are located in restroom areas
- Handwashing procedures are taught to students
- Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout every building, classroom, and bus
- Staff and students are encouraged/taught to sneeze or cough into their elbow

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities

- Classrooms and buildings are thoroughly cleaned daily and after each class
- Full building disinfection using Clorox 360 is performed weekly

Improving ventilation

- Opening windows on buses
- Outdoor classes and learning opportunities
- Frequent filter changes on HVAC units
- Maintenance on HVAC units

Contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine

- Each campus has a dedicated isolation room for staff/students
- Quarantine protocols are listed above for students or staff who are positive, symptomatic, or have come in close contact with a positive individual
- Campuses are sending home notifications to families in the event of a positive case
 - The district also maintains a public dashboard with active cases

Diagnostic and screening testing

- Staff and students are asked to screen daily for symptoms consistent with COVID-19
- COVID testing is available for GISD staff

Community vaccinations

- Vaccinations were offered before school at registration during our “Back to School Vaccination Clinic.”
- A second opportunity will be available in the fall along with the flu vaccinations

Accommodations for children with disabilities

- All students receive opportunities to social distance or wear personal protective equipment
- All students are encouraged and receive instruction on washing hands and personal hygiene

Coordination with state and local health officials

- GISD coordinates with Johnson, Tarrant, and Hood County health officials
- Reporting is submitted to the health department and DSHS

Continuity of service (academic, social, emotional, mental health, health, food services, and other needs)

- Food service workers wear masks and/or face shields
- Plexiglass barriers are present throughout the food line and at the registers
- Limited numbers of students are allowed in the line at a time
- SEL staff and curriculum have been added to meet the needs of students at every campus
- GISD has returned to full face-to-face instruction
